The Holy Eucharist

Welcome to our Eucharist today. 'Eucharist' means 'thanksgiving' and is the central act of worship in the Christian Church, during which we remember and give thanks for all that God has done for us in Jesus. While we're kept apart, it's not possible for us to receive Holy Communion however, a prayer for 'spiritual communion' is included in this order of service - although we can't receive Christ in the bread and wine of the Eucharist, in prayer we open our hearts to him and receive the gift of his love and grace.

The Gathering

[Stand]

In the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Grace and peace be with you
and keep you in the love of Christ.

The priest introduces the confession, followed by a time for quiet reflection.

... Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**
... Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.**
... Lord, have mercy. **Lord, have mercy.**

*The priest offers the absolution, to which we respond: **Amen.***

The Gloria in Excelsis

Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King,
Almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.
Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

The Proclamation of the Word

*The Collect, to which all respond: **Amen.***

The First Reading, which may be followed by a responsorial psalm.

[Sit]

This is the word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

The Gospel

[Stand]

Listen to the gospel of Christ according to Saint *N.*

Glory to you, O Lord.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

The Sermon

The Apostles' Creed

[Stand]

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

**He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.**

**He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.**

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

**He ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints,

the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body

and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Intercessions

[Sit]

Appropriate responses may be used, for example:

Lord, in your mercy,

hear our prayer.

The prayers may end with this prayer:

Merciful Father,

accept these prayers

for the sake of your Son,

our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Peace

[Stand]

A sentence is used to introduce the Peace.

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

And also with you.

The Preparation of the Altar

Two prayers to which we respond:

Blessed be God for ever.

The Prayer over the Gifts is said,

*to which we respond: **Amen.***

The Eucharistic Prayer

[Remain Standing]

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The priest praises God for his mighty acts, to which we respond:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might,

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

The prayer continues until:

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come in glory.

The prayer concludes:

... for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Holy Communion

[Kneel or Sit]

Jesus taught us to call God our Father,
and so we have the courage to say:

Our Father... / Ein Tad...

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**Though we are many, we are one body
for we all share in one bread.**

Jesus is the Lamb of God
who takes away the sins of the world.

Happy are those who are called to his supper.

**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

The priest and people receive Holy Communion.

The Dismissal

Give thanks to the Lord for he is gracious:
his love is everlasting.

*The Post-Communion Prayer, to which we respond: **Amen.***

Notices for the week ahead.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

*The Blessing, to which all respond: **Amen.***

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

In the name of Christ. Amen.
